

What Should You Do If You See Someone Being Bullied



1. Tell the bully to **STOP** if it is safe to do so
2. Tell an adult straight away.
3. Comfort the person who is being bullied and encourage them to tell an adult
4. Reassure them that it isn't their fault

What Will School Do

1. If you or someone else reports a bullying incident in school, we will speak to you to find out what has been happening .
 2. We will speak to the Bully
3. We will speak to the parents of the victim and the bully
4. We will remind the bully that bullying is not acceptable in our school
5. We will make sure that a member of staff has regular check ins with the victim.
6. A plan will be put in place for the victim to prevent bullying from happening again
7. The school will follow the behaviour policy and the bully may have to miss playtimes and may be suspended .
8. School will work with the Bully and their parent /carer to help improve their behaviour

What Is Bullying

A bully is someone who hurts another person more than once, by using behaviour that is meant to scare, hurt or upset that person. It can be one person or a group of people.



Different Types Of Bullying

Verbal Bullying



Teasing people, calling them names, threatening and insulting people

Physical Bullying



Punching, kicking, pushing hitting or spitting

Social Bullying



Spreading rumours about someone, hurting peoples feelings, not allowing them to be included.

Cyber Bullying



Saying unkind things, by email, text, telephone or on social media

Reasons Why People May Choose to Bully

Racist Bullying



Bullying someone because of their skin colour, race or what they believe in

Sexist Bullying



Bullying someone because of their sex (whether they are a boy or a girl)

Homophobic Bullying



Bullying someone due to their gender or sexuality. Calling someone gay or lesbian is Homophobic Bullying.

Disability Bullying



Bullying someone due to their needs or a disability they may have.

What Should You Do If You Are being Bullied



1. Ask them to stop
2. Ignore them and walk away.
3. Tell any adult in school that you trust
4. Tell an adult at home or a member of your family
5. Tell a friend or someone in your class
6. Post a worry in the Worry box in school
- 7 Always remember that it if you are being Bullied it is **not your fault** and you are **never alone**
