

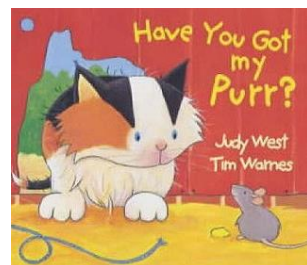

KEY VOCABULARY



Our story this half term is 'Have you got my purr?' by Judy West.

The book is about a kitten who cannot purr and asks the other animals for help.

MATHS

Children will be –
 Sorting, classifying and matching object into different groups, such as things that are the same or different.
 Starting to subitise amounts up to 3. Subitising is the ability to look at an amount and instantly recognise how many without counting one to one.
 Continuing to practise being a careful counter when needed.
 Listening for the stopping number to say how many is in a group.
 Exploring numbers up to 3 in different ways.

LITERACY

Children will be –
 Listening and joining in with our new story.
 Learning key words and phrases from our story.
 Learning to sign our new vocabulary through Makaton.
 Learning about what a character is and who the characters in our story are.
 Playing games to help them remember and order the story.
 Begin to think about the beginning and the ending of our story.
 Continuing to recognise their name and practise writing it.

PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

The children will be –
 Continuing to develop their fine motor skills through dough gym sessions.
 Using the bikes and scooters to develop their gross motor skills outdoors.
 Making marks with pencils, crayons, paint and chalk.

COMMUNICATION AND LANGUAGE

The children will be –
 Learning nouns and verbs from our story and using these words to say simple sentences.
 Listening out for sounds all around them including musical sounds, body sounds and the initial sounds in their names and other words.
 Listening to and following two part instructions during play and within class games.

CREATIVE DEVELOPMENT

Children will be –
 Singing and joining in with actions to farm songs and rhymes.
 Exploring colours and materials to make animals masks to use to retell our story.
 Retelling the story using props and puppets with their peers.

UNDERSTANDING THE WORLD

Children will be –
 Finding out about life on the farm and how we take care and look after animals.
 Learning the names of the baby animals and matching them to their parents through games and stories.

PSHE

Children will be –
 Welcoming new children who are going to start this term and continuing to make friendships.
 Remembering what makes a good a friend and to share and take turns when playing in the environment.
