### KEY VOCABULARY



village

**Village** - A village is a place where people live and it is normally in the countryside. It has a population ranging from a few hundred to a few thousand. It is smaller than a town.



town

**Town** - A town is much larger than a village, and has many more things like banks, restaurants, pubs and places of entertainment. A town's population can range between 3,000 and 100,000.



city

**City** - A city is a large town. They have things like hospitals, universities and good road, rail and air connections. It has a population of around 100,000 to one million.



population

**Population** - The amount of people living in one area.



landmark

**Landmark** - It is a building or feature that is easily seen and recognised from a distance.



countryside

**Countryside** - is the land away from towns and cities



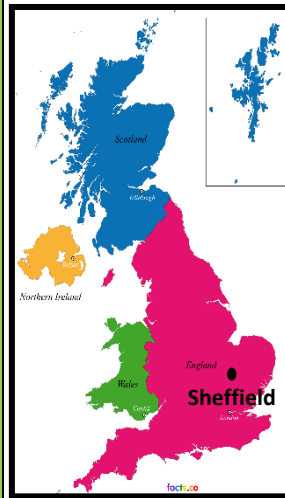
Human feature

**Human feature** - Something that has been made or put there by humans. They include bridges and roads.



Physical feature

**Physical features** - Something that has been made by nature. They include hills and mountains.

The city has the world's oldest football club—Sheffield FC. It has two professional clubs that each have a stadium—Sheffield

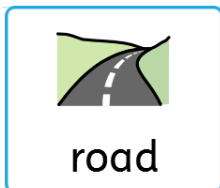
Wednesday (The Owls) and Sheffield United (The Blades). When the two teams play each other, it is known as the Steel City Derby.
