Natural Hazard: a natural danger to people and their property, and their way of

Natural Disaster: a natural event that causes areat damage or loss of life.

Volcano: an opening in the Earth's crust where red-hot rocks and gas break to the surface from the underground.

Earthauake: a sudden movement, or tremor, in the Earth's crust.

Core: the hot centre of the Earth.

Mantle: the solid part of the inside of the Earth. Between the core and the crust.

Crust: the thin top layer of the Earth.

Tectonic plate: a massive slab of rock that makes up the Earth's crust.

Plate boundary: the place where tectonic plates meet.

Magma: molten rock below the Earth's surface.

Lava: magma that reaches the Earth's surface.

Volcanic Ash: tiny pieces of material that are ejected when a volcano erupts.

- 1. A natural disaster is a violent event which humans cannot control.
- 2. A natural hazard can lead to a natural disaster.
- 3. A natural disaster can cause loss of life or damage property, and typically leaves some economic damage in its wake.
- 4. A volcano is an opening in the Earth's crust where red-hot rocks and gas break to the surface from the underground.
- 5. Volcanos happen on weak spots on the Earth's surface where magma can break through; often these are on or near places where tectonic plates meet or part.
- 6. Although erupting volcanoes are dangerous and destructive. the long-term effects can be beneficial to people as the material they emit produces fertile soils.
- 7. Earthquakes are caused by a sudden release of energy in the Earth's crust. They are often the result of instability created where tectonic plates meet and fault lines form.
- 8. Most volcanoes and earthquakes occur at plate boundaries.
