#### **KEY VOCABULARY**

Boycott: To avoid or refuse to do something.

Abolish: put an end to it Activist: a person who works to bring about political or social changes

by campaigning in public.

Segregation: the official practice of keeping people apart,

Racism: the belief that people of some races are not as good or important as others.

Campaign: a planned set of activities that people carry out over a period of time in order to achieve change Equality: people having the same rights and chances/opportunities as others Inequality: when people do not have the same rights as others.

Legacy: something which is a direct result of an event or action and which continues for a long time afterwards. Protest: showing publicly that they disagree with something.

This lasted for a year.	28 <sup>th</sup> August 1963 The civil rights march on Washington. Rosa attended the march. Martin Luther King gave his 'I have a Dream' speech .	24 <sup>th</sup> October 2005 Rosa died aged 92 of natural causes.
