Discuss how these apps can help us to talk online. Who has seen someone use these apps? Who uses these apps themselves? Are there any communication apps that we've missed?	Activity 1: Communicating online Print images of various items - physical communication, online communication and other things. Children circle the ones that we use to communicate online.

P1 - Online Friends Understand that it is easy to hide your identity online Understand that it is important to be kind online	Read Webster's Friend: https://www.goodreads.com/book/show/259 11753-webster-s-friend http://www.borndigitalbooks.co.uk/product/ websters-friend/ Ask these questions: • Is it easy to pretend to be someone else online? [If we want to, we can hide our faces and voices online. Strangers online could change their name, age, profile picture and we would never know] • Why was Webster lying about his life? [He wanted to be popular, to impress his new friend] • Why did he believe the other person? [We are used to people telling the truth] • What did Webster do that was really sensible? [Tell his dad, as soon as he felt worried] • Do you think Webster's dad would be angry, or happy? [He should be happy, because Webster asked him for help, and staying safe is the most important thing] • Should you be honest about everything online? [No] • What if someone asks for your real name? Your address? The name of your school? A photo of you? [We should still use a username that is not our real name — this is not lying, but keeping ourselves safe.
